Please remember that dogs on Doggy Day Outs are **not allowed to be taken to dog parks or introduced to other dogs (including personal pets belonging to the volunteer)**. This is because dogs often require longer introductions and a 2-3 hour span is not enough time to complete a proper introduction for them to play together.

Rules

- Dogs must be kept on a leash 6 feet long or less (no retractable leads) at all times. They will not be allowed off leash.
- Field Trips must occur at one of the approved locations.
- Dogs may not be taken to dog parks and may not be introduced to any other dogs (including volunteer's personal pets) while on a fieldtrip. Maintain a safe distance between your EPAS dog and any other dogs at all times.
- Dogs should be secured via clip-in harness or crate while riding in a vehicle.
- Remain aware of the dog's level of comfort throughout the entire trip, including any potential discomfort while meeting new people.
- Do not use headphones or talk on a cell phone while walking the dog. Be aware of your surroundings and respectful of the needs of other people and the business/location you are visiting.
- Keep the dog hydrated as needed throughout the Doggy Day Out.
- Consider the pet's comfort level during all experiences. If your pup is not comfortable in a crowded restaurant, do not force them to interact. Perhaps a calm picnic in the park would be better!
- Be aware of weather conditions during your Doggy Day Out. Do not take dogs on hikes during the hottest part of the day, and be aware of the pavement temperature.
